- **1:1 Support:** Every child is allocated a dedicated member of staff, fostering strong bonds and enabling sustained concentration during one-to-one activities.

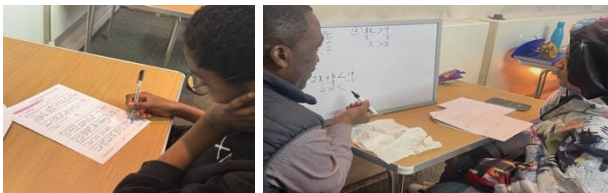
Outdoor Learning:

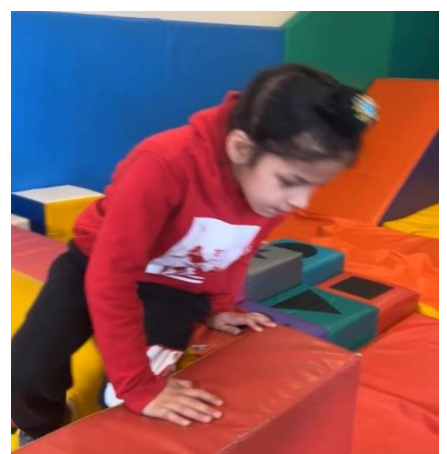

More about your child's learning at our St Albans' day centre

Learning and Independence

Our students are developing essential skills in fine motor control, pencil grip, and letter and number formation. Some are focusing on cognitive development and number skills, working at their individual workstations with increasing independence and minimal adult support.



Building Confidence in Group Learning

Learners participate in daily group activities, with some beginning to anticipate, initiate, and actively join in tutor time routines. Many are using their voice switch to say "good morning" when their photos appear on the screen, demonstrating an understanding of cause and effect with minimal adult prompting.

Sensory Learning & Communication

Students engage in alternative seating positions, communicate through touch and music, and explore a variety of sensory materials. During **Tacpac** sessions, learners express preferences by requesting 'more' of their favourite sensory items, fostering communication and choice-making.

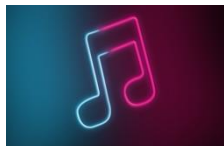
During **Attention Autism-Bucket Time** children take part in a short activity to engage visual attention. We follow simple rules: "Look but don't touch". The children then engage in longer visual activities to build their attention span, experimenting, exploring and taking turns.



SEES Communication Statement

At SEES, we recognise and value all forms of communication. Students communicate through objects, photos, symbols, and speech, and we ensure that every form is acknowledged and supported. Our Total Communication approach includes the use of visual timetables, 'now and next' boards, routines, and structured activities to enhance understanding and interaction.
