We're so proud of their resilience and curiosity – a huge well done to them and their tutors!



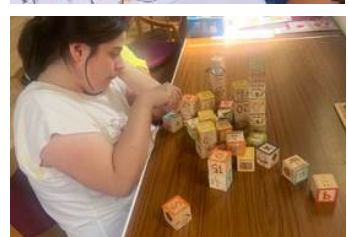
How We Communicate:

- Sign language and symbols
- PECS (Picture Exchange Communication System)
 - Communication books and switches
- Visual timetables and 'Now and Next' boards
 - Music, touch, and sensory cues

We support each child to express themselves in the way that works best for them – whether it's using Makatonsigns, requesting 'more' during Tacpac, or pressing their voice switch to say "good morning" in group time.
